

INITIAL COMPETENCY ASSESSMENT FOR BEDSIDE HANDOVER REPORT (RN)

This form is to describe what is entailed in completing the initial competency assessment Bedside Handover Report. It is to be used as a guide for the preceptor and the employee to understand the expected knowledge, skills, and attitude (KSA) that is required to give a thorough handover report that transfers knowledge to ensure safe and optimal patient outcomes from one shift to another.
